

RAINBOW MEN START FOR HOME

New York City's Famous 69th is Among the Units

Coblenz, April 7.—Two more train loads of happy, smiling soldiers of the 42d (Rainbow) Division started Saturday afternoon for home by way of Brest. The soldiers composed the 145th Infantry Regiment, New York City's famous 69th Division headquarters and attached units left this morning.

There were cheers, but no tears, as the trains pulled out. The soldiers were in the highest spirits as they waved farewell to their comrades who are to follow within the next few days.

Major General Flagler, the commander of the Rainbow Division, left Ahrweiler several weeks ago and is expected to land in Boston next week, to make preparations for the landing of his troops. It is not known here where the various units of the division will disembark, both New York and Boston being mentioned.

EARLY PEACE IS NOW APPARENT

Much of the Uncertainty Seems to Have Been Dispellled

Paris, April 7.—The confident statement of Premier Lloyd George that the peace treaty will be concluded by Easter, is supported by predictions repeatedly made by less prominent members of the peace conference and dispelled much of the hopelessness and uncertainty in which many important problems of the conference seemed to have been enshrouded.

Agree on Reparations The Council of Four on Saturday reached an agreement on the principles of the indemnities and reparations to be paid by Germany and examination of the details will begin immediately, the newspapers say.

The Echo de Paris says that compromise has been reached on all debatable points regarding the sum to be paid at once by Germany and the payments in the future.

France and Belgium First The Journal says there are indications that the rights of France and Belgium to prior consideration in the payments by Germany have been recognized.

Plans for continued occupation of the left bank of the Rhine have been abandoned and the allies will depend upon an economic blockade as the means of pressure on Germany.

WILL EXPAND SANATORIA

State Health Authority Outlines What the Commonwealth Proposes to Do

Major John D. McLean, assistant commissioner of the State Department of Health and who has been placed in charge of the State's tuberculosis work, has issued this statement in regard to the plans of the Department of Health for expanding the work.

The control of Tuberculosis in Pennsylvania was considered of such grave importance by Dr. Samuel G. Dixon, the first Commissioner of Health, that he asked a separate and distinct appropriation from the Legislature for the purpose of expanding the work.

The present administration realizing the value of the enormous work done by Dr. Dixon has, without hesitancy, decided that this should be carried on to a still greater degree and efficiency.

Increased optimism in diplomatic circles is noted by the press, while in editorials the newspapers express satisfaction over the progress made on the question of reparation and indemnity.
