AN ORDINANCE

To authorize the paving and curbing of Home street from Berryhill street to Kensington street, and providing for the payment of the cost thereof. Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Harrisburg that it is hereby ordained by authority of the same, that Home street from Berryhill street to Kensington street be and the same is hereby authorized to be paved with first class sheet asphalt on a concrete base and curbed with granite or granolithic curbing, the cost and expense thereof to be assessed according to the foot front rule.

AN ORDINANCE

To authorize the paving and curbing of David Street from Park Street to Whitehall Street, and providing for the payment of the cost thereof. Section 1.
