

### HOOVER REPORTS MONTH'S WORK

#### Value of Supplies Reaches Ninety-Five Million Dollars Through Allies' Council

Paris, April 14.—Herbert Hoover, director general of relief, has issued a review of the measures carried out by the United States, Great Britain, France and Italy during the month of March through the co-ordination of the Supreme Economic Council. The total value of supplies distributed in the month was approximately \$95,000,000, of which all but about \$2,300,000 was furnished on a basis of deferred payment.

The supplies amounted to 35,941 tons divided as follows: Cereals, 2,624; rice, 12,842; peas and beans, 8,052; fats and meat, 34,173; condensed milk, 4,122; clothing, 4,483; miscellaneous, 8,322. Poland received 5,174 tons of supplies, Finland, 2,344 tons; the States, 2,753; Czechoslovakia, 2,951 tons; German Austria, 38,156 tons; Greater Serbia, 23,330 tons; Romania, 25,967 tons; Turkey, 2,238 tons; Armenia, 5,251 tons; Belgium, 14,604 tons; Northern France, 6,300 tons, while some food went to Germany.

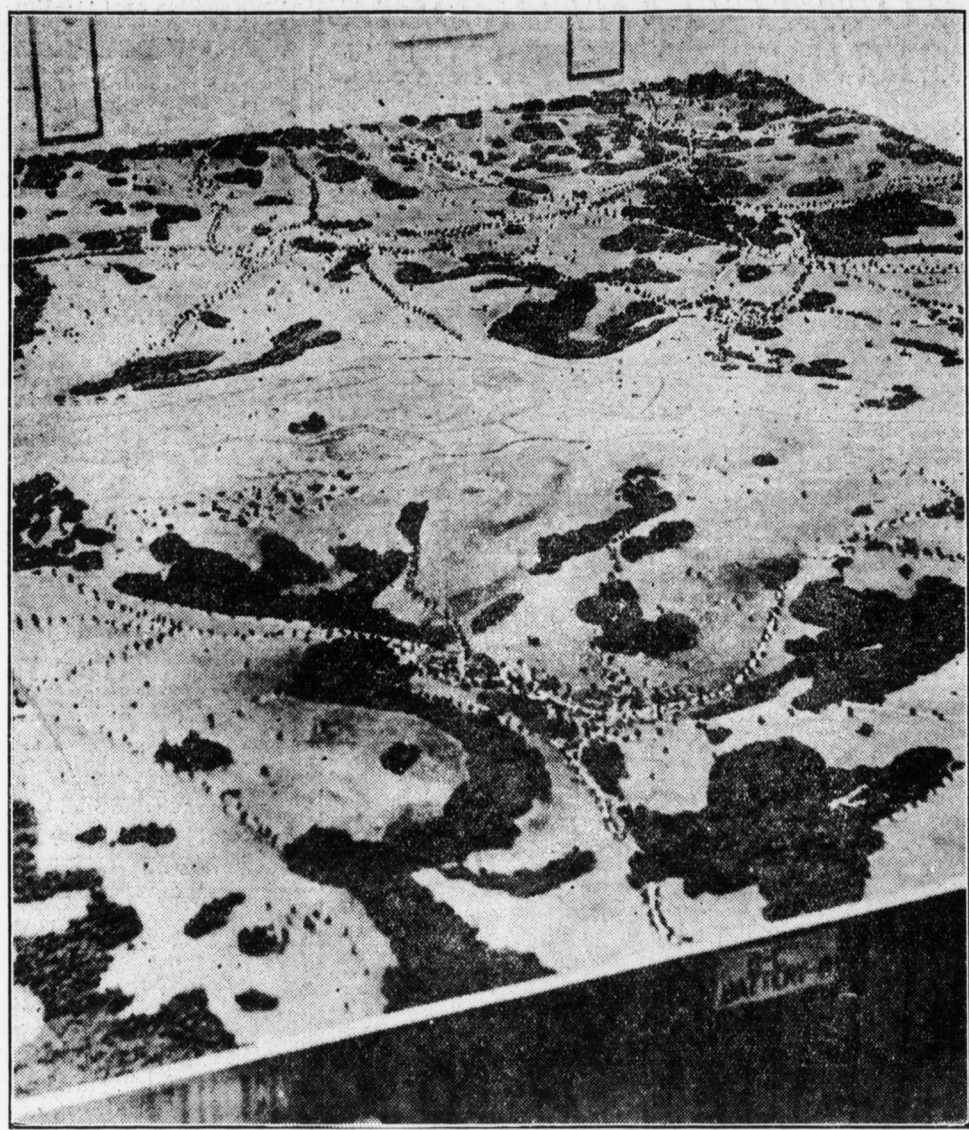

### WHERE WAR TRICKS ARE LEARNED



Lieutenant Charles M. Hutchinson, of the Heavy Artillery, who has just joined the United States Army Recruiting Station at 325 Market street, has been on duty with the "big gun corps" at Camp Eustis, Virginia. The lieutenant has many interesting stories to tell of the activities of the artillery regiments stationed there. Camp Eustis is a training station of the heavy artillery, and is used by the army to give it actual field practice with powder and shell. A large area of wild woodland and forest is used as a range. The big guns roar and great projectiles explode, just as in actual combat. The lieutenant exhibits a very unique war map which has just been completed at Camp Eustis. It was made under the personal

supervision of Colonel Meade Wildrick at the camp, Lee Hall, Va., and is a French battle map showing the battle line of August 6, 1917. That part of it including the famous "big gun corps" at Camp Eustis, Virginia. The map is made of wood and covers a floor space of about nine hundred square feet. All the towns, railroads, canals, bridges, big guns, trees, sand pits, quarries trench systems and so on are carefully put on the map. All the hills valleys rivers lakes roads and paths are shown. These details, of course, were accurately made to scale. "No Man's Land" with its innumerable shell holes is there with remarkable fidelity. Every house in the town and cities are reproduced, and located on the map in their true position. This

Chemin de Dame sector was one of the bloodiest parts of the French line. The French and Germans always with great losses. The net locked horns there several times, work of trenches which resulted from these actions have been actual-ly cut into the map, and embankments thrown up in front. The heavy artillery are using this map for firing practice, not using powder and shell, but by means of a chemical device which places a puff of smoke and a burst of flame, exactly where a shell would fall if the real explosives were used. By means of the practice gained in a few days' work with this miniature range officers at Camp Eustis have improved their fire control scores seventy-five per cent. in a single week.

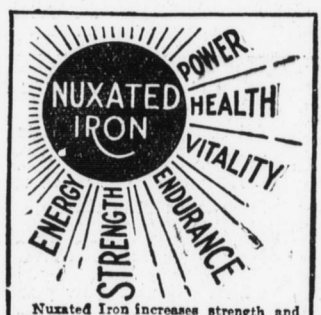

### SOLDIERS KILL HUN MINISTER

#### Drag Herr Neuring to the Elbe River, Throw Him in, and Then Shoot Him

Copenhagen, April 14.—Herr Neuring, War Minister in the government of Saxony, was killed at Dresden Saturday by disgruntled soldiers, to whom the minister had refused a hearing. The War Ministry was stormed by demonstrators, who dragged out Herr Neuring and threw him into the Elbe, where he was shot and killed as he tried to swim to the bank.

### RAILROAD MEN OUT ON STRIKE

#### D. L. and W. Shopmen Demand Discharge of Efficiency Expert

Syracuse, N. Y., April 14.—Sixty employes in the power department of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad have gone out on a strike to enforce their demand for the reinstatement of a union member at Scranton, Pa., and the discharge an efficiency foreman who pert. The strikers are not directly affiliated with the "big four" brotherhoods.

Wounded patients in the Dresden hospitals, says the Dresden dispatch entailing the occurrence, collected in the morning in the theater square to protest against the order issued by Herr Neuring, the effect that the wounded in future should receive only peace time pay. Five or six hundred men then formed a procession to the War Ministry and sent a deputation to see the minister, who refused, however, to receive them.

Binghamton, N. Y., April 14.—Division Superintendent Frank Cizek, of the Lackawanna, announced that forty machinists had quit work last night in sympathy with the Scranton strikers. Most of the men are employed in the local roundhouses.

### Reports Cause Rush of Germans Eager to Come to America

Coblenz, April 14.—Statements published recently in newspapers in unoccupied Germany that German laborers were being sought for employment in the United States caused such a rush of civilians to Third Army headquarters in Coblenz that American officers caused to be published denials of the truth of these stories. Many men and quite a few women and girls, having heard of the newspaper articles from the other side of the neutral zone, came to Coblenz from towns and districts as far as fifty miles away.

### League of Proletarian Culture One Year Old

Petrograd, April 14.—The league of Proletarian Culture, founded in February, 1918, has celebrated its first anniversary. The league, which has several branches, embracing plastic art, dramatic art and music, and has publishing offices, clubs, etc. Each branch has rooms for practical training and studios in which workmen can practice the new proletarian culture. The literary branch has issued a dozen publications including a monthly review. The theatrical section, which numbers about 500 members, produces plays.

### State College Professor Decorated for Bravery

State College, Pa., April 14.—James W. Crowell, assistant professor of Romance Languages at the Pennsylvania State College, now serving with the American Y. M. C. A. in Italy, has been awarded the Italian War Cross for bravery under fire. During the height of the last Italian offensive, on the Asiago Plateau, Mr. Crowell heroically aided several wounded soldiers, exposing himself to great danger. He continued with the Italian Army into Austria and his services throughout the engagement resulted in his citation for bravery.

### MADE STEADY JOBS

During the period of war-time migration of negroes to the Northern States, those southern plantation owners who had provided year-round employment for their tenants lost very few men, comparatively, according to one of the reports published in a bulletin on "Negro Migration in 1918-17," issued by the Department of Labor.

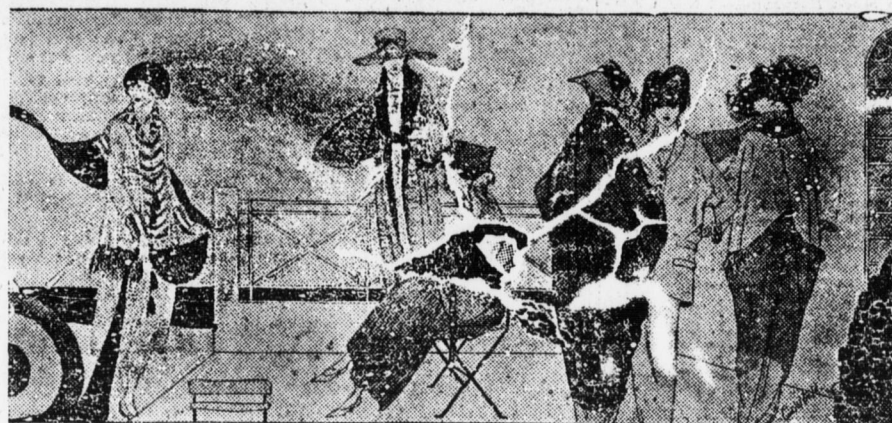

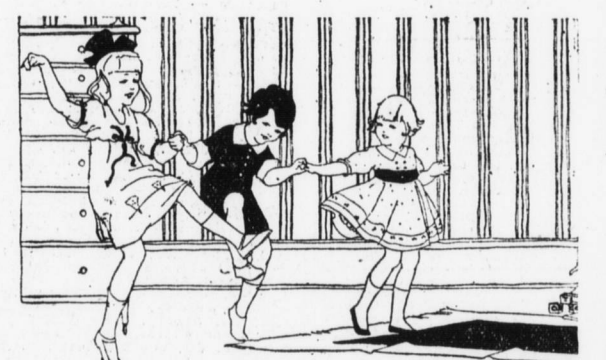
