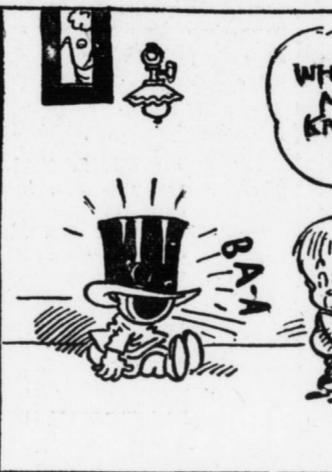
W. R. Hearst Made Chief Beneficiary by Mother

ICELAND, STORAGE DEPOT, PROBABLE

Distributing Point For Wheat From Western Canada to Europe

Winnipeg, Man., April 18.—Iceland, it seems probable, may become a storage depot and distributing point for wheat shipped from western Canada to Europe by way of the Hudson Bay railway.

The East Asiatic Company, according to advices from Denmark, is planning to build storage elevators at Reykjavik in Iceland and establish a line of steamships between that town and Port Nelson, the railway terminus on the western shores of Hudson Bay.

The Hudson Bay railway will shorten the railway haul of grain from western Canada to Europe by 1,000 miles, will materially reduce transportation costs and increase the profits of the farmers.

Reykjavik is on the southwestern coast of Iceland about two-thirds of the way on the North Atlantic voyage between Port Nelson and Liverpool. Much of the wheat bound for Europe could be shipped out of Canada to Iceland before Hudson Bay freezes. It could then be transhipped to Europe at leisure as Reykjavik is an open port for the greater part of the year.

The plan, as announced is greatly interesting to western Canada grain growers. The Hudson Bay road, which is a branch of the Canadian National Railway system, will extend from The Pas in Manitoba to Port Nelson. It will be 424 miles long and all but about 80 miles of track is laid. The last link, it is expected, will be completed this summer.
