Peace Conference Crisis Uppermost in London; One Paper Attacks President

London, April 25.—The Peace Conference continues to be the paramount topic of comment in London's morning newspapers. The support they give to President Wilson's and Italy's views are, respectively, about evenly divided, but with two or three exceptions, opinions are expressed cautiously and with a manifest desire to show friendliness for both Mr. Wilson and Italy and to avoid saying anything likely to hinder the speedy restoration of harmony.

Amicable Solution of Italian Situation Is Believed to Be Making

Paris, April 25.—Peace conference circles were inclined to believe to-day that an amicable solution of the Italian incident was in the making. For one thing, Italy has shown her desire to maintain good relations with America by the fact that the Italian delegations remaining in Paris will continue to collaborate in the work of the inter-allied commission not pertaining to the actual work of the Peace Conference.

Italians Cry 'Viva America!' Page Replies 'Viva Italy!'

Rome, April 25.—A huge crowd of manifestants, parading through Rome toward the Capitol, passed before the American embassy late to-day just as Ambassador Page came out for a walk. The demonstrators shouted "Viva America!" The Ambassador replied: "Viva Italy!"

State Health Department and has already issued instructions for the putting into execution of some of the plans which can be carried into execution now. Enthusiastic about the plan of Col. Edward Martin, State Commissioner of Health to make Harrisburg a model city from health and sanitary standpoints, Mayor Keister communicated with Colonel Martin to learn from him what specific recommendations could be suggested for the improvement of Harrisburg at this time. The co-operation of the various city departments and civic organizations were pledged to the movement by the mayor. Colonel Martin in answer wrote that he appreciated the progressive attitude of the mayor and promised that the heads of the several divisions would be asked to make specific recommendations to him. Since then heads of three of the divisions have already been in communication with the mayor, outlined their suggestions for improvement, suggested the methods to be pursued and reiterated the promise of Colonel Martin that the city would be aided by State Department inspectors and officials in whatever work they started. William C. Miller, head of the Division of Public Health Education, strongly approved plans being made for the annual cleanup of the city which will be held during the week
