

Dislays Proof of His Loyalty to America

Peter Ivokovic, a Slavonian by birth, yesterday displayed prominently in his barber shop at 846 South Second street, two honorable discharges from the United States Army, as well as his warrant as a first class sergeant. Ivokovic says he has been falsely accused of his loyalty, and he is displaying his discharges as proof of his loyalty to his adopted country. He was naturalized in 1915.

Ivokovic entered the army in 1911 and saw service in the Philippines. He was honorably discharged in 1914. He reenlisted in 1917 and was assigned to the 59th Infantry. Then came the false accusations, and instead of being sent to France with his company he was held for investigation. Cleared of the charges he was sent to France with the 214th Engineers, saw service and was discharged on February 24th last. In some way the false charges reached Steelton, much to his indignation. Now as proof he displays the honorable discharges.
