

Record Wheat Crop of 900,000,000 Bu. Forecast

Washington, May 3.—Prediction of the Department of Agriculture for a wheat crop this year even larger than the record-breaking crop of 1914, was repeated yesterday by the United States Chamber of Commerce in a report based on statistics obtained from all sections of the country. The report stated that an average never before equaled had been planted and a yield of 900,000,000 bushels was forecast.

Canada to Run Fastest Train Across Continent

Montreal, May 3.—The "Trans-Canada," designed to be the fastest express train between the Atlantic and Pacific Coasts, will start June 1 over the Canadian Pacific on its first

run from Montreal to Vancouver. It is scheduled to make the trip in 93 hours and 30 minutes. The best time from New York to the Pacific Coast is 98 hours and 50 minutes. The eastward running time of the "Trans-Canada" will be an hour and fifteen minutes faster.
