LAST FIGHTER IS TO BE HOME FROM WAR BY AUGUST

Secretary of War Baker So Announces at Washington Today

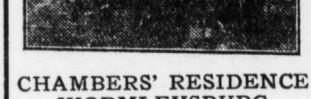
Washington, May 7.—Secretary Baker announced to-day that by August the last man of the American Expeditionary Forces will have been withdrawn from France. He said this estimate was based on the movement of 300,000 men a month to the United States.

Already, Mr. Baker said, the American forces in France have been reduced to the Army of Occupation. Plans have been completed to supply the force in Germany through the ports of Antwerp and Rotterdam, removing the necessity for maintaining the 700-mile line of communication from Brest.

The French ports will be maintained, however, for the withdrawal of the American Expeditionary Forces.

Allied Troops Take Mesalskaya

London, May 7.—Allied troops advancing southward along the Murmansk railway on Saturday captured Mesalskaya, twenty-five miles south of Urozero, in a war office announcement says. The Bolshevik resistance was strong.
