The Austrian treaty has begun to take form. Portions of it already have been drafted.

It appears that instead of Germany being required to pay the entire indemnity demanded by the Allies, a considerable sum will be demanded of Austria, the estimate of this sum at present bing

This indemnity provision and the delimitation of the frontiers of the new state will be the main features of the treaty now in the making. Provision is to be made for dividing Austria-Hungary's pre-war debt among the new states formed from territory

The frontiers between German-Austria and Italy and probably the Adriatic settlement will also figure in the Austrian treaty.
