Leaves Million to Improve Philadelphia

Philadelphia, May 13.—Nearly \$1,000,000 is bequeathed in the will of Thomas Skelton Harrison, former American minister and consulgeneral to Egypt, for a trust fund to be used in improving governmental conditions in Philadelphia. Mr. Harrison died a week ago.

The testament provides for a board of seven men to apply part of the income to the fund to procure honest and impartial enforcement of all contracts made by the city, for furnishing labor, erection of bulldings and other public improvements, cleaning of streets, removal of garbage, furnishing water, gas, electricity and transportation facilities.
