MONUMENTS TO THREE SOLDIERS

State of Pennsylvania Will Transfer Memorials at Gettysburg to Government

Gettysburg, Pa., May 27.—Dedications of the three monuments on the Gettysburg battlefield, one to General Humphreys, one to General Geary and one to General Hayes, has been changed from the Fourth of July to the first, the change being made because of the inability of Governor William C. Sproul to be present on the Fourth.

Instead of moving from one monument to another on different parts of the battlefield, the entire ceremony will take place at the historic rostrum in the National Cemetery and a separate speaker will make a dedicatory address for each of the three monuments.

On behalf of the State of Pennsylvania Governor William C. Sproul will present the three monuments to the National Government, and they will be accepted by the Secretary of War Newton D. Baker.

JEWS APPEAL TO PRESIDENT

Call Upon Him to Take Steps to End Massacres in Foreign Lands

Atlantic City, N. J., May 27.—Resolutions calling upon President Wilson and the delegates of all other countries attending the Peace Conference to take proper and effective measures to "stop the massacre and pogroms of Jews in foreign countries" were adopted by the Independent Order B'Nai B'rith Abraham in session here yesterday.

The resolution, the text of which was cabled to President Wilson, further declared that no nation be recognized by the Peace Conference which does not give full religious freedom and full civic equality to its Jewish inhabitants.

A lengthy discussion followed the report of the committee on the grandmaster's recommendations, and it was finally decided to charge each member ten cents a month extra as a tax to help meet the endowment fund.

Would Have Royal Arcanum Hang Flag in Each Lodge Room

Atlantic City, N. J., May 27.—Resolutions calling upon the 1,538 subordinate councils of the Royal Arcanum to have as part of their paraphernalia the Stars and Stripes, which shall be conspicuously displayed at each meeting and that every one of the 150,000 members of the fraternity salute the Nation's flag upon entering the council chambers, were presented by a special committee at the convention of the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum here.

Paris, May 27.—The President of China has notified the Chinese delegation by cable that a meeting of the Chinese cabinet and the speakers of both houses authorized the delegation to sign the peace treaty with reservations regarding Shantung.
