Decause of **Fire Loss** Claiming that sparks from one of the city fire engines, which was in service on the night of March 22 when the drug warehouse of Bow-man, Mell & Company, was gutted by fire, set fire to the property at 35 South Thirteenth street, occupied by Miss Anna M.
