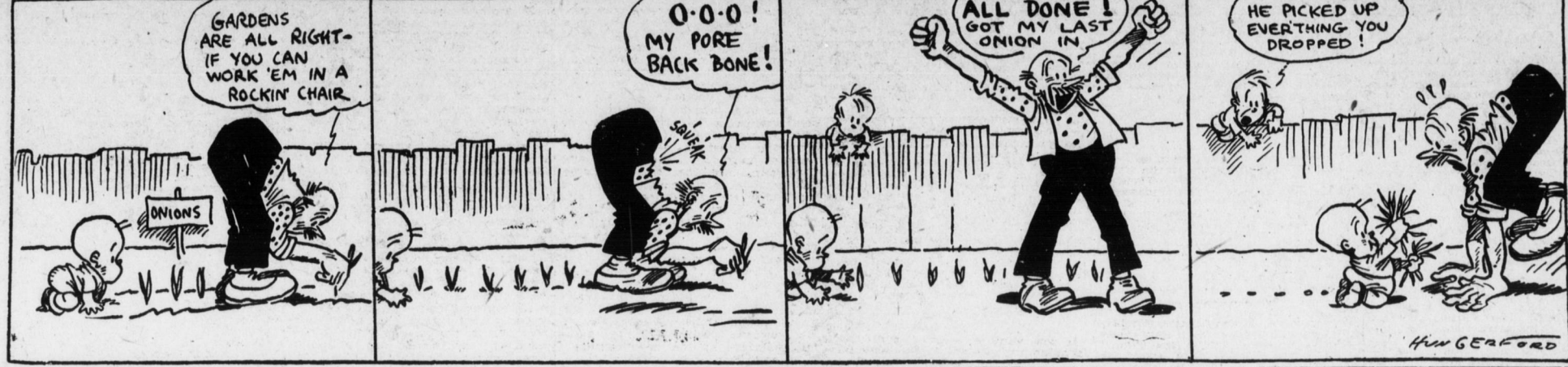

Everything Is Ready For Big Motor Races

Indianapolis, May 30.—Everything was in readiness to-night for what many believed would be the greatest automobile racing event in the history of the world here tomorrow when 33 cars will start a 500-mile race at the Indianapolis speedway. The starter's signal will be given promptly at 11 o'clock and experts have estimated the 500 miles should be run shortly after 4 o'clock.

Although the first races on the speedway track since 1916, the event has lost none of the international character, it had assumed before the war. American drivers and machinists will be pitted against foreign drivers and machines. The winner will receive a purse of \$20,000; second place will get \$10,000 and the next eight will receive purses ranging from \$5,000 downward. The total of the awards is \$50,000.
