AIR PHOTOGRAPHY
Washington — A great deal has
been written of the aviator and airplane, but not so much has been set
forth concerning the exploits of the

The photograph showed the German's trenches, his machine gun emplacements, his long-range artillery, penetrated camouflage and noted the location of many other things it was necessary for the army to know. The importance of this branch of the service is now recognized, and the army is soon to establish a school for aerial photography, it was announced by Lieutenant Colonel William F. Pearson, chief of the air service.
