Bids For City Water

Favor Railroad Plan

Scranton, June 6.—Measure railroad arnings with a yardstick.
Abolish regional directorships. No ailroad representative in cabinet and of ederal department of transportation.

Such are the main features of a plan for return of the railroads under private ownership suggested vesterday by Luther M. Walter, of Chicago. Mr. Walter explained his plans to the Pennsylvania Bankers' Association at the opening session of its twenty-fifth annual convention at the Hotel Casey here. He is general counsel for the National Association of Owners of Railroad Securities.

Substantially the proposition favored by the organization, which represents holders of eight billions out of eighteen billions of outstanding railway securities, is the scheme popularly known as the "Warfield plan." The recommendation by which labor is to share in all railroad profits in excess of 5 per cent. is regarded as one of the most radical features of the plan.
