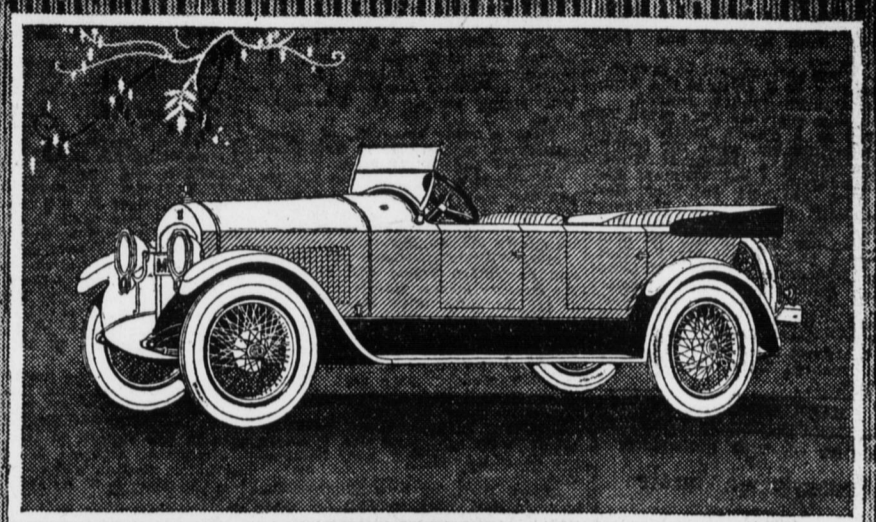

Makahashi, Minister of Education recently pointed out in a speech at a political meeting that Japan may be left in an isolated position with relation to the great powers. He said: "Russia and Germany are now ruined and there are only three great powers in the West—Great Britain, France and America. These three powers

can easily get together because their language and strength are about the same, but Japan being a different race may have to stand absolutely alone. "Japan, therefore, must provide against this by regulating her finance and strengthening her national defense."
