MOWRY SPEEDED TO JAIL IN TRIAL OF JAP CHARGES

American Missionary Has No Time to Procure a Lawyer. Tokio, June 7.—The Rev. E. M. Mowry, of Mansfield, Ohio, an American Presbyterian missionary, had no lawyer to represent him in the court of Pyeng Yang when he was convicted recently and sentenced to six months penal servitude for sheltering Korean agitators in the independence movement. The trial was held after one day's notice to the accused and neither he nor his friends who were in court watching but taking no part in the case were notified until after the trial that they could have asked for and obtained a postponement.

COTTON SPINNERS OF LANCAASHIRE RESUME WORK

Operators on American Import Are Again Back at Work. London, June 7.—After having kept their mills idle since April 10, most of the Lancashire spinners of American cotton resumed activity April 28. The 100,000 operatives affected are now back at work. Nothing, says the American Chamber of Commerce in London, has brightened the outlook in Lancashire so much as the government's recent removal of the quantitative restrictions on exports to the European neutrals and the abolition of the blacklists for those countries.

Civil War Veterans Attend Encampment at Lancaster

Columbia, Pa., June 7.—Members of General Welsh Post, No. 118, G. A. R., will take part in the parade of Civil War veterans at Lancaster next week at the meeting of the State Encampment. Of the famous One Hundred and Twenty-second Regiment of Lancaster county soldiers, only two, George Smith, a retired railroad engineer, and Lorenzo McCracken, a retired fireman, remain in Columbia, and both expect to be in line in parade. Amos R. Hougendobler, who served over three years in the Civil War and the oldest shoe merchant in Columbia, expects to take his place in the line with the others.

Accuse Haller's Army of Attacks on Jews

New York, June 7.—Two new pogroms in Poland—one at Poryck, Volhynia, May 22, in which eight persons, mostly women and girls, were killed, and another at Czenstochow, May 22, with a death toll of nine—were alleged yesterday by the Zionist organization of America, which said the reports came from its bureau in Copenhagen. The same advice announced that Jewish members of the Polish Diet had addressed an open letter to Premier Paderewski, describing the outrages and accusing the troops of General Haller's army of attacks upon Jews.
