Hungry Czecho-Slovaks New York, June 9.—"As long as I am in Prague, I am a Czecho-Slovak, I will take care that there shall not be one hungry child in the Czecho-Slovak Republic." These words of Captain Joseph Shaw, a young officer of the United States Army and one of the leaders of the Prague Mission of the Ameri-can Relief Administration promise to rank among the historic utter-nees of the war with Marshal Jof-fre's famous phrase "They shall not pass" and Pershing's "Lafayette we are here." Captain Shaw's statement was quoted in the press throughout Czecho-Slovakia in daily and weekly papers and in publications of all poli-tical and religious shades when he-made the assertion at a public meet-ing held upon his arrival in Prague to take charge of the American Re-lief Administration's work in feeding the starving and long undernourished children of the republic. The entire Czecho-Slovak press took this occa-sion to print articles on the splen-ding those who suffered innocently during the war.


