

YANKEE TROUPE  
CLEAN UP AGAIN

Gets Big Approval at the Orpheum Theater Last Night

The Twenty-eighth Division theatrical troupe "went over the top" again at the Orpheum Theater last night, and when the curtain dropped at the end of the performance there was an air of certainty in the audience that the Yankees can entertain just as well as they can fight. This interesting group of entertainers, all men masked as women, will appear again to-night.

The forest stage setting which was used all the time during the four months' tour in France was obtained in Brierley from a theater which had been used by the Germans, and the foundation of material on which the painting was done was made of twisted paper instead of burlap, showing the scarcity of cloth goods and at the same time the ingenuity of our late foe. This setting, along with the piano, which was taken from the Crown Prince's dugout at Mont Sec, was carried from place to place in Army trucks and it was necessary for the members of the troupe to do their own baggage handling.

During their four months of real barnstorming they played two return engagements at Neufchateau which was the headquarters for the advance section of the 28th Division. They then went to Vitell, a famous French summer resort, where there are many natural springs, large, beautiful hotels and gaming establishments, while the troupe played in the Casino, where it is said Gaby Deslys danced for King Manuel, in Nancy, which is considered by most of the French as a small Paris, the show played one night in the large opera-house and two nights in the Y. W. C. A. hotel.

Weather permitting at 6:30 o'clock a pageant of the various classes will be held on the campus. The banquet which will begin at 7:30 o'clock, will be held in the school dining-room. Immediately after the Alumni promenade will be held in the gymnasium.
