Marshal Foch, commander-inchief of the Allied armies, has issued orders that preparations be made for an advance eastward from the Rhine bridgeheads as soon as the Germans refuse to meet the Allied terms, if that action should be taken. American forces are all ready and, if the occasion should require, can start on short notice in battle formation toward the interior of Germany.

Austria Makes Reply
The Austrian reply to the fragmentary Treaty submitted at St. Germain has been handed to the Peace Conference and is being translated for submission to the Council of Five. Nothing as to its nature has been made public at Paris, but Vienna dispatches say that newspapers there are publishing a summary of the reply, which seems to consist largely of objections to the territorial clauses of the Treaty.

Foreign Ministers Meet
With President Wilson in Belsium and Premier Lloyd George at Verdun to-day and to-morrow, the Council of Five will mark time. The only Peace Conference body in session to-day was the Council of Foreign Ministers. Final consideration of the Austrian terms is planned for Friday, and it is believed that the Austrians will receive the full text of the terms on Saturday.
