ifty-Sixth Anniversary of Its Destruction to Prevent Confededate Advance

Columbia, Pa., June 28.—To-day Saturday, June 28, in the fifty-sixth saturday beyond control of the authorities as a result of Communistic activities. Columbia, Pa., June 28.—To-day for Saturday, June 28, in the fifty-sixth is anniversary of the burning of the Columbia bridge. The bridge was burned at the time of the Confederate invasion of Pennsylvania and was destroyed by fire 'o pr.vent the Conferderate troops from crossing the Susquehanna river into Lancaster county. General John B. Gordon's brigade of General Jubal A. Early's division of Confederate troops occupied Wrightsville, June 28, 1863, and threatened Columbia. Colonel Jacob G. Frick, commanding the Federal emergency troops on the Columbia side, and with four companies, one colored, had crossed to Wrightsville and fortified the heights a half-mile beyond the town. He had no artillery, and upon the advance of Gordon's troops, the Union forces retreated across the river and then burned the bridge. General Gordon and his bridge of Georgia troops remained in Wrightsville, and, it is said, helped to extinguish the flames of the burning bridge, which had spread to the town and threatened some of the houses and burned a few buildings along the river front.
