ADOPT NON PARTISAN LAWS By Associated Press. Fargo, N. D., June 28.—With 1,306 precincts out of 2,856 in North Dakota voting, the Non-Partisan League laws, voted on in Thursday's election, last night showed 35,262 affirmative and 35,628 negative votes. These returns indicated the adoption of all the laws by a substantial majority.

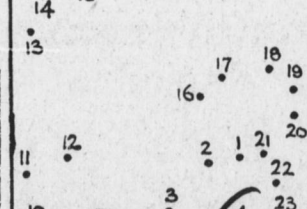

Find Much Sulphur in Heavy Shower of Rain

Dawson, Y. T., June 28.—A sulphur laden shower of rain, a rare phenomenon, fell over Dawson and its vicinity Thursday. A 30-minute down pour left pools on sidewalks streaked with a yellow substance which chemists declared was sulphur and which they believed was carried in the upper atmospheric currents from some distant volcanic eruption. A similar precipitation has been reported at Dagle, a hundred miles north of Dawson, and also in northern British Columbia.

Koreans in Siberia Plan Demonstration Against Japs, Is Report

Tokio, June 28.—A Vladivostok dispatch received in Tokio says the Koreans there and in other districts of Siberia are secretly planning further demonstrations against Japan. The anti-Japanese Koreans are encouraged by the fact that among various sections of the Japanese, including some newspapers, an adverse criticism is directed against Japan's administration. The Koreans, says the dispatch, are under the impression that even if they fail to convert Korea into an independent state, they will ultimately be successful in causing Japan to alter her military administration so as to increase the happiness of the Koreans.
