





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

Dawson, Y. T., June 28.—A sulphur Dawson, Y. T., June 28.—A sulphur laden shower of rain, a rare phenomenon, fell over Dawson and its vicinity Thursday. A 30-minute down pour left pools and sidewalks streaked with a yellow substance which chemists declared was sulphur and which they believed was carried in the upper atmospheric currents from some distant volcano eruption. A similar precipitation has been reported at Eagle, a hundred miles north of Dawson, and also in northern British Columbia.
