Berlin, July 7.—Prince Eitel Frederick, of Prussia, second son of the former German emperor, has sent the following telegram to King George:

"In fulfillment of the natural duty of son and officer, I, with my four younger brothers, place myself at your majesty's disposal, in place of my imperial father, in the event of his extradition, in order by our sacrifice to spare him such degradation."

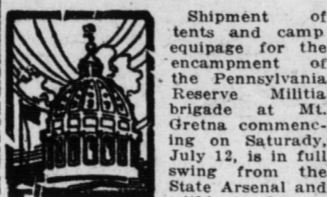
"In the name of Princes Adalbert, August William, Oscar and Joachim. "EITEL FREDERICK."

ARSENAL SENDS CAMP EQUIPAGE

Reserve Militia Encampment Will Start on Saturday



Shipment of tents and camp equipage for the encampment of the Pennsylvania Reserve Militia brigade at Mt. Gretna, Pa., on Saturday, July 12, is in full swing from the State Arsenal and other quarters.

Practically all of the stores and equipment have been moved to the camp by motor truck and much of the company property will go that way.

Change in Order.—The State Live Stock Sanitary Board has issued a modification of the quarantine established some six months ago against the shipment into Pennsylvania of horses, mules, etc.

Object to State.—Objections filed by a depositor and a stockholder of the Park Bank, of Pittsburgh, to the proposed sale of the former site of the bank have been ordered heard by the Dauphin county court on July 14.

Asked to Speak.—Dr. Thomas E. Finegan, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, has been invited to deliver the address at the dedication of Carbondale's new high school.

Road Bought.—The State Highway Department has bought for \$24,000 the Clay and Hinkietown turnpike in Lancaster county, and it will soon be freed.

Philadelphia's Report.—The report in the Philadelphia Rapid Transit system made by the city and to be sent to the Public Service Commission, shows an outlay made of \$48,768,607.38, and a value of \$60,000,000 with \$17,000,000 book value.

Contracts Listed.—The Public Service Commission has listed for hearing contracts of the York Haven Water and Power Company with Londonderry, Derry and Lower Swatara townships and North and South Annville and Londonderry townships in Lebanon county.

Increased Capital.—The Raiff and Nestor Company, of this city, has filed notice of increase of stock from \$140,000 to \$300,000.

Wart Checked.—State Department of Agriculture officials here today have halted the potato wart, which did so much damage in the lower anthracite field.

Big Cases Up.—The Public Service Commission has scheduled for hearing on Wednesday the contracts between the Philadelphia and Reading railway and Montgomery county for the bridge and crossing abolition improvements at Conshohocken.

Greatest Road Work.—Bids for the construction of over one hundred miles of State highway will be opened at the State Highway department tomorrow, this being the largest offering of road work ever made by any State in the union if not by any country.

Fire Destroys Heart of Farming Village

Harrisburg, Pa., July 7.—Fire of unknown origin which started in a garage early yesterday morning destroyed the general store of William Bickling, the garage of A. T. Dymond, harness store and dwelling of George Osborne and the blacksmith shop of Harry Heckroth.

FORMER EMPEROR CONSIDERS FATE OF HIS PROPERTY

Consults With Dr. Kriege Over His Castles and Other Estates

Amerongen, July 7.—The former German emperor has been discussing his financial problems for more than a week with Dr. J. Kriege, who has been in charge of the imperial estates and funds in Germany since the Hohenzollern abdication.

Has Plenty of Money The former emperor is not short of money, as he possessed a considerable amount on deposit in Holland before war began.

Future of Property Unknown The German government's intentions concerning the former emperor's private fortune cannot be gleaned here.

Austrian Treaty Ready For Delegates Tomorrow

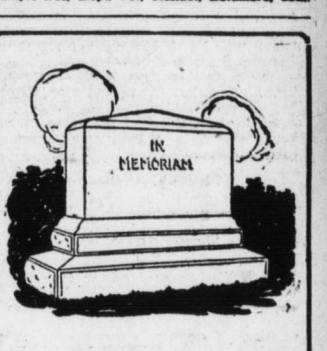
Paris, July 7.—The proposed Austrian Peace Treaty will be ready for presentation to the Austrian delegation on Tuesday.
