

ASK BIDS FOR 97 MORE MILES

Highway Department Will Go Over the Five-Hundred-Mile Mark by August First

The State Highway Department, which to-day opened bids for more than 103 miles of highway construction, announced that it would receive tenders on July 29 for ninety seven more miles. Bids have been opened since the first of the year for more than 453 miles and contracts let for 334 miles at \$13,244,318.07. Much of this work has been started and if the plans of Highway Commissioner Lewis S. Sadler are carried out the greater part of the work awarded since the middle of February will have been completed by the time winter sets in.

The work to be let late this month will include stretches of main highway in Montgomery, Chester, Erie, Lawrence, Washington and Westmoreland. Most of the roads will couple up with highways being improved by the State and counties or by counties.

The projects for which bids will be opened on July 29, include the following: Adams county, Butler township, 23,246 feet; Adams county, Tyrone and Strahane boroughs, 13,733 feet; Beaver county, Eastvale borough and N. Sewickley township, 14,481 feet; Bradford county, Johns, Sayre and S. Waverly boroughs, 15,297 feet; Bucks and Montgomery counties, New Britton and Montgomery, 15,898 feet; Chester county, Franklin and New London, 21,819 feet; Chester county, East and West, Marlboro townships, 16,509 feet; Chester and Delaware counties, Tredyffrin and Easttown township and Radnor township, 46,815 feet; Crawford county, Fernon, 18,619 feet; Crawford county, East Mead, 18,840 feet; Erie county, Girard township and E. Springfield borough, 20,490 feet; Erie county, North-east township, 7,900 feet; Erie county, Mill Creek township, 21,120 feet; Fayette county, Menallen township, 19,943 feet; Jefferson county, Pine Creek township, 25,972 feet; Lawrence county, Union and Mahoning townships, 37,723 feet; Montgomery county, E. Norriton, 5,575 feet; Northampton county, Bethlehem and Lower Nazareth townships, 25,655 feet; Susquehanna county, Hopewell borough, Lathrop, Lenox, Harford and New Milford townships, 53,896 feet; Union county, Lewis township, 14,484 feet; Washington county, E. Northampton township, 9,480 feet; Washington county, Caronsburg borough, 1,106 feet; Westmoreland county, N. Huntingdon township, 7,484 feet; Westmoreland county, Hempfield township, 12,965 feet.

Bids are also asked for the construction of two bridges. One of these is a triple span structure in Nicholson township and borough, Wyoming county, on the Lackawanna trail. The other is on route No. 127, in York township, York county.

One of the construction jobs for which bids will be opened July 29, is that on the William Penn Highway in Armagh township, Mifflin county, where it is planned to put down 24,049 feet of new construction. Another important piece of work is that planned for route No. 41, in Adams county, north and south of Biglerville, on the road between Carlisle and Gettysburg. Additional construction is also planned for Adams county on highway route No. 23, which connects Gettysburg and Harrisburg. Important construction planned for Bradford county is that on route No. 287, between Towanda and Waverly, N. Y., one of the principal north-south routes in Pennsylvania. In Crawford county 18,619 feet of brick and concrete are planned for route No. 82, west of Meadville. Another job in Crawford county is that on route No. 89, on the thoroughfare between Meadville and Titusville.

There are three projects scheduled for Erie county. One is planned to put down 20,490 feet of new highway on route No. 86, which is the thoroughfare connecting the Ohio and New York highway systems through Pennsylvania. Another job is that in Northeast township where 7,900 feet of concrete will be put down south of the borough of Norcross. In Mill Creek township, on the Ohio-New York link, 21,120 feet are scheduled. In Fayette county nearly 20,000 feet of brick and concrete will be put down on route No. 112, west of Uniontown. This is on the road connecting Uniontown and Waynesburg. In Jefferson county, 25,972 feet of concrete and brick are scheduled for route No. 80, the thoroughfare connecting Brookville and DuBois. Lawrence county gets an important piece of construction, 29,628 feet of concrete and brick, to be used for Union and Mahoning townships, immediately northwest of New Castle, on the road leading to Youngstown, Ohio. One of the greatest jobs for which bids will be opened July 29, is that on route No. 153, Montgomery county, from Philadelphia city limits to Springhouse. Additional Lackawanna trail construction is that on route No. 9, where 53,896 feet of concrete is to be laid in Hopkinton borough, Lathrop, Lenox, Harford and New Milford townships.

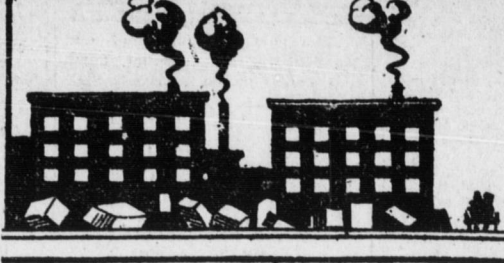
