Benefit to Short Rider Only

Trenton, Aug. 2.—Three-cent trolley carfares for short-distance riders will be effective in New Jersey on September 14. This will be the rate within the first mile zone, with two cents for each additional mile. One hundred and seventy-four cities and towns served by the Public Service Railway Company are affected by the order announced yesterday by the Public Utilities Commission.

The present flat rate is sevent cents for a ride as long as fly miles and one cent for a transfer. Under the new system of fares transfers are abolished. The three-cent fare is for a ride within a given zone, and when a passenger passes into another one, although he may not ride a full mile, he must pay an additional two cents. Chilidren under seven years of age, accompanied by adults, will ride free. School tickets will be issued at the same rates as at present, and all commutation tickets now effective will be continued.
