STATE APPLE CROP WAY DOWN

State Reports Unfavorable According to Officials of Agricultural Department

The apple crop of Pennsylvania, which was estimated at 13,000,000 bushels for 1918, is declared by the statisticians of the State Department of Agriculture to look like 3,262,500 for 1919 owing to weather conditions. The reports obtained by the bureau of statistics from its crop reporters indicate a great variation in production. In many counties there was a heavy drop of apples in June due to the cold weather in April which prevented fertilization; hard, cold rains and other adverse conditions.
