Y., Aug. 4.—Plans are complete for a state-wide meeting of the Women's Joint Legislative Conference and the State Federation of Labor, at Syracuse, August 27, which will bring into action the first big gun in the present campaign to nominate and elect a New York legislature favorable to workmen's health insurance, minimum wage, and eight hours for women workers.
