More New Dwellings Will Go Up in the City; Building Boom Continues

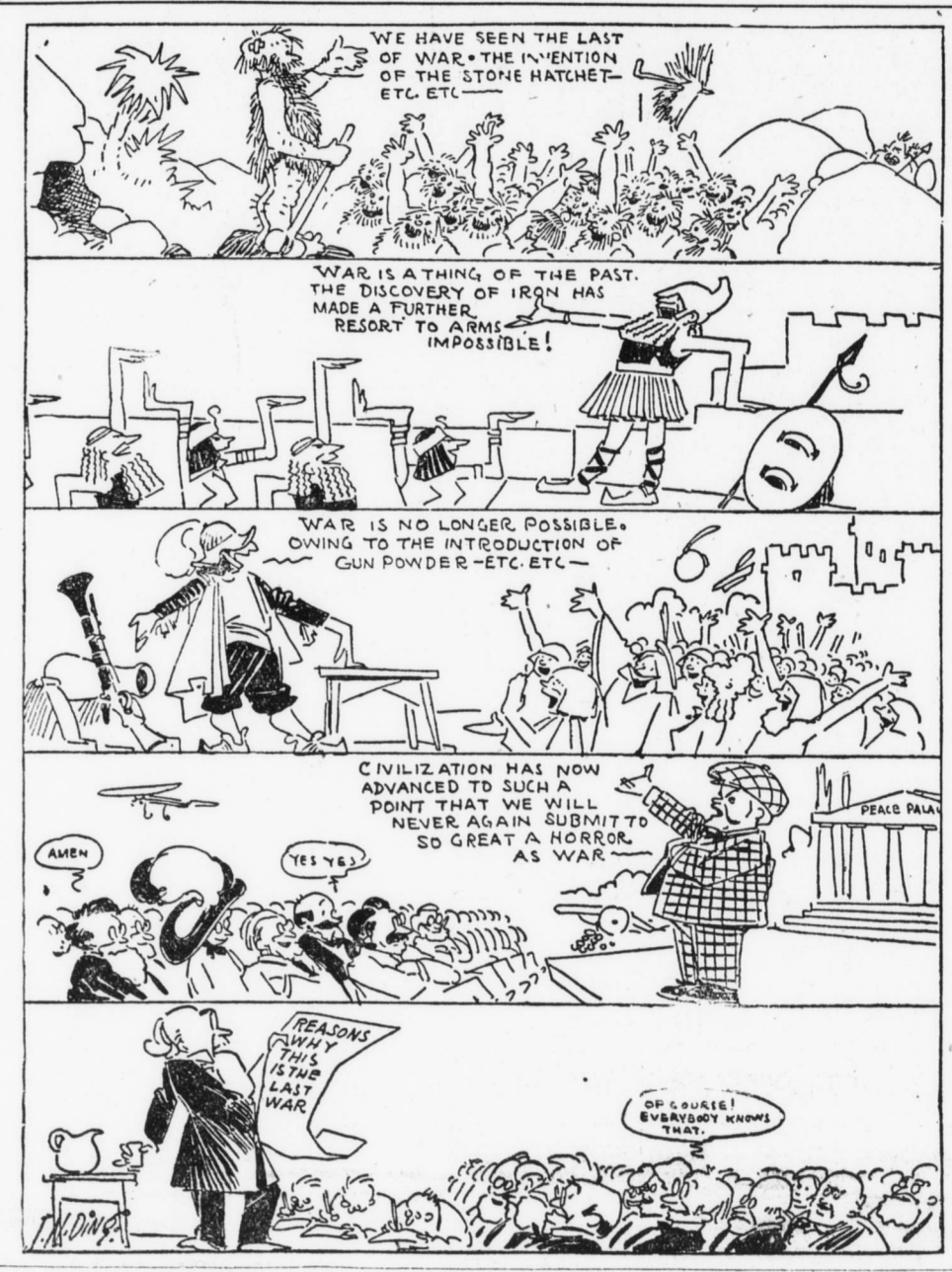
