Escaping from Russia at the end of 1917, I had to cross the North Sea from Bergen to Aberdeen. Two other Americans were making the same voyage, and one of them gave much of his waiting time in Bergen to reading the Bible. The submarine menace was at its height. His companion jeered. I, too, smiled. Neither Heaven nor earth can have much respect for such a sudden accession of fright-born religious interest. Still, the incident revealed that English-speaking people instinctively turn to the Bible for light and comfort in perplexity. When feet are called to tread a difficult and dangerous way that Book really is a light to one's path. The sober conviction of many thoughtful persons is that a widespread wogues of Bible study would do more than any other one thing to steady the course of America and Canada in this critical hour.  
Our Nation's Rock Foundation  
Next year is the three hundredth anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrim Fathers; and the occasion recalls the profound historical fact that the civilization of this western continent has been shaped by the ideals of God-fearing, Bible-believing, Scripture-reading men and women. As Queen Victoria is said to have told an African chief that Britain's greatness is all founded upon the Bible; so we may reverently say that our western ideals of liberty and democracy spring straight from the Book which our forefathers accepted as their supreme law.
