STRIKE IN LOCAL PLANT UNLIKELY

Little Probability of Steel Strike in Other Plants Affecting Steelton

With a nation-wide steel workers' strike impending no fear is being felt in Steelton and there is a noticeable lack of any agitation whatsoever. Officials of the plant think a strike in the Steelton plant highly improbable. And officials of the local unions seem to feel the same way about it.

There are six local branches of the union, all of them organized within the last two years. Union men declare that they include in their membership more than half of the employees of the Steelton plant. Union workers in the plant appear not to be greatly concerned about the strike. Officers of the local unions declare that they have received absolutely no advice from the American Federation of Labor for the local unions to take action, should such advice be received, action favoring a strike, while possible, appears doubtful.
