

FIGHTING FOES SHIPPED HOME

Moewe's Captain Among 1,600 Germans Departed; Werner Horn Another

New York, Sept. 26.—Almost 1,600 German prisoners of war, who had been held at Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., are being shipped to Rotterdam from the Port of Embarkation, at Hoboken.

Captain Max Thiersehn, who was commander of the seized German liner Prinz Eitel Frederick, was one of the prisoners. He came from Fort McPherson, Ga.

Another prisoner was Captain C. Zuckschwerdt, formerly commander of the German cruiser Cormoran, who was interned at Guam, P. I. He blew up his ship. He has been appointed chairman of a committee of the pris-

A partial list of those aboard as obtained from headquarters of the Port of Embarkation, follows: Eighteen hospital cases (insane) from St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Washington; 39 Germans from Fort Douglas, Utah, including Wilhelm von der Linde (alias van Linden); 25 German civilians accepting voluntary deportation including six hospital cases; 62 civilians from Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., including Werner Horn, who had been held at Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., following instructions from the local agent of the Department of Justice; 61 officers, prisoners of war, from Fort McPherson, including Thaddeus Zielinski, who is to be held in Hoboken because he is a Pole; 52 warrant officers from Fort McPherson, 208 petty officers from Fort McPherson and 101 chief petty officers from Fort McPherson.

SEE NEW PLAN FOR BUILDING UP GERMAN ARMY

Newspapers Indicate Move Is to Establish a Reserve Force

With the American Forces in Germany, Sept. 26.—An entirely new scheme for establishing a reserve army in Germany in anticipation of some future opportunity to establish German military power is seen by some German newspapers in a plan they have just discovered and exposed.

While the scheme is confined to only one regiment and so probably has no sanction from the War Ministry it is an indication, in the opinion of American Army officers who for eight months have been studying demobilization of the German forces, of how hard Prussian militarism dies.

Urged to Sign Pledges. The Lichtschlag Corps in Westphalia, which is the nucleus of the Thirty-first Reichswehr brigade, has sent out circulars to all men who have served in this volunteer unit since the armistice, urging them to sign a pledge to answer to a call to the colors in the event of general disorder or a new revolution.

The circular, according to the newspapers, says that the corps is organizing a "reserve" from among the best of its released soldiers, this reserve to be called into the service of the corps in time of need. De-Feucht, in a recent issue, demanded to know who had given the corps the right to establish such a reserve and to promise regular Reichswehr or National Army pay to these "reservists" whenever called.

Veterans Parade Prior to Big Dance. After parading through the principal streets last evening preceded by the Municipal band, members of Howard Le Calde Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, held a dance last night in the Armory.

Members of other foreign wars and all men who were overseas in this war made up the parade of the organization. The post is at present conducting a campaign for membership and their evening secured fifty more members.

First Boxing Show by New Local Association; All Stars on Program

Harrisburg's new organization of boxing promoters, the Harrisburg Boxing Association, is to make its first bow to the public to-night in a four-bout show, in which there are to be thirty rounds unless knockouts diminish the number.

The event is to be staged in the Chestnut Street Auditorium, starting at 8.40 o'clock. The seat sale will open at the hall at 6 p. m.

The card is one of the best that has been offered in Harrisburg for some time. Jackie Clark, one of the principals in the ten-round windup event, has a national reputation, his feat in winning the middleweight crown of the American Expeditionary Forces with the United States Army bringing him into the limelight for a time.

The local lodge had sixty-eight of its members enlisted in the United States service during the World War, four of whom have paid the supreme sacrifice.

Will Treat 69,000 Who Were Rejected Because of Tuberculosis

Efforts of the National Tuberculosis Association are now being directed to secure the names of each of the 69,000 men who were rejected for military service by draft boards because of tuberculosis affection. It is hoped to bring about a co-operation of effort that would aid the affected men in their fight for recovery and to prevent the spread of the disease.

Follow-up systems are now being employed by the various agencies engaged in combating tuberculosis, but according to officials of the National Tuberculosis Association many men are hanging back and others cannot be located. It is to reach these two elements that the appeal is made for co-operation.

Emphasis is laid on assertions that tuberculosis is not hereditary, and that it is preventable and curable. In order to reduce the death rate the public is asked to assure the success of an extensive campaign against the disease by buying Red Cross Christmas seals liberally during the drive, beginning December 1, when seals to the value of more than \$8,500,000 will be offered for sale throughout the country.

RETURNED SOLDIER HURT

Elizabethtown, Pa., Sept. 26.—Paul Lehman, of Paradise, a returned soldier, was seriously and probably fatally hurt yesterday while working on a high grade bridge over the Lebanon division of the Pennsylvania Railroad, when he was struck by a motor and fell 40 feet to the tracks below. He was removed to a Lancaster Hospital.
