New York, Sept. 25 — Asserting that "we must face frankly the fact that a most dangerous inter-racial situation now threatens our country," the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America made public here to-day a "constructive program" for protecting negroes against mob violence, bettering their condition, and removing the cause of racial troubles.

Cab Drivers and Guides of Rome Preyed on the Doughboys

Rome, Sept. 25.—"Itching palms" were extended to the enlisted personnel attached to General Pershing's staff during the American Commander-in-Chief's visit to Rome. Cab-drivers, professional guides, professional beggars, novelty vendors and guidebook sellers preyed upon the American doughboys with avidity. One soldier paid \$5 to be driven from the station to St. Peter's, a trip ordinarily costing 40 cents or by trolley, four cents.
