Several wagers, ranging from \$500 to \$2,500, were made on to-day's contest. Previous to the opening game, odds were given that the White Sox would win the series.

How Money Figures for World's Series Players

Cincinnati, Ohio, Oct. 2.—The National Commission announced that the total attendance at yesterday's game was 30,511. The total amount of revenue taken in, not including the war tax, was \$98,775.00. The commission's share of this was given as \$2,877.80, leaving the remainder to be divided at \$88,900.20.

Reuther's Pitching Was Full of Real Puzzlers

Cincinnati, O., Oct. 2.—Tabulation of the pitching record of yesterday's game shows that Reuther, winning Cincinnati pitcher, pitched 21 strikes and 29 balls, while the three White Sox pitchers—Cicotte, Wilkinson and Loudermilk—sent over 21 strikes and 48 balls. The record shows that Chicago batters found Reuther's pitching thirty-eight times, mostly for high flies and fouls.
