

Sir Thomas Lipton Sends His Official Challenge

New York, Oct. 7.—Formal announcement of the receipt of a challenge for the America's cup from the Royal Ulster Yacht Club of Belfast, Ireland, was made yesterday by Secretary George A. Cormack, of the New York Yacht Club.

The challenge was forwarded in behalf of Sir Thomas Lipton, who named Shamrock V as the yacht to be used in the races of 1920. No answer has as yet been made by the New York Yacht Club, but a favorable reply is generally expected.

Sir Thomas inaugurated his fourth attempt to lift the America's Cup in 1913 with a challenge for a race the following year. The challenge was accepted and the challenging yacht, Shamrock IV, was enroute to this country under its own sails when war was declared. Shamrock IV put into Bermuda and later reached this port after the danger

of capture by German ships had passed.

With the beginning of the world-war the international yacht race was abandoned and the Shamrock IV was placed in dry dock in Erie basin.
