Scientific Discussions by Garrett P. Serviss

Here is the romance of a huckleberry plant, a thousand years old and eight acres big. Besides its age and size, this remarkable plant has for a special attraction the fact that it is the only one of its kind in the world...

This is a state on the authority of Frederick Coville, the botanist, who avers that the least that American naturalists can do for this "charming little thousand-year-old lady of the forest," is to return to her the feeling of affection, which she has shown for them, by trying to keep her living forever. Her home is on the westward slope of a timbered hill in Perry County, Pennsylvania.

Although the huckleberry seems to be an underestimate of the real age of this hidden-seeking plant, whose pleasure is found not in towering each century a little nearer the sky, like the giant sequoia, but in huddling close to the soil, and stretching farther and farther toward the receding and deceptive edges of the world.

Coville estimates that not less than 1,200 years must have elapsed since the baby plant began to expand from its cradle-place like a wave on water, give it time enough, and take its way to the top of the mountain, individual might be pictured as embracing the continent. Its light blue berries are as bright and its dark green leaves as tender at the circumference as at the center.

Age doth not wither it, nor distance weary its unending youth. At every step it renews its strength. It gives no heed to no seedling, and the most painstaking search, Mr. Coville found not one. Its environment invites it to perpetuate its kind in the ordinary way of its individual nature forbids. It would rather die than to give up its own personal self than with its offspring. It produces seeds, but they are sterile, or at best of exceedingly feeble vitality, and do not germinate.

We find exemplifications of the principle of this all-grasping, self-centered life in the social, political, and industrial world. Some are great and some are small. Carried to the extreme the principle would cover a planet with a single inhabitant, a Briareus, whose arms would reach round the globe and touch to each other at the top of his shoulders. In this view that creeping "little old lady of the forest" induces a shudder for monstrosity is a quality that is not to be over-estimated.

If that same eight-acre were covered by thousands of intermingled huckleberry plants, each having its own independent rootstock, there would be a great number of them when you find that in all one single plant you cannot regard it without a start and a tingle of the nerves, behind which even a kind of fear may lurk.

The greater wonder of this triple-tandem a thousand pairs of eyes, for he knows that their power does not surpass that of the strongest individual eye behind them; but put all those eyes into a single gigantic head—and then!

Notwithstanding the facts that this strange huckleberry plant in Pennsylvania produces no offspring and that, with a single exception, it is the only wild plant of its kind that has been found, with some promise of success, to propagate the species by cross-fertilization.

For this purpose Mr. Coville has hunted up the other of the two living wild huckleberry plants and has found it on South Cameron, in Delaware. Its existence had long before been known, but afterward its precise location was forgotten. It required considerable detective skill, based upon special scientific knowledge, to hunt something like that of a skillful prospector for a lost mine—to run down the plant. When found it proved to be relatively small, covering an area only twenty feet square.

Like its greater sister it lives to itself alone, producing no seedlings. But by cross-pollination of the flowers of the two huckleberry plants, one growing in Washington, which may indefinitely perpetuate the race. Only five localities have ever been known in which this plant grew, and as already stated, it is now being raised by Mr. Coville through the use of official and specimen, ballots—four city loans to be printed on ballots for Harrisburg, all of which are to be bound in books of one hundred (100) each for the ensuing election to be held Tuesday, November 19, 1919. All ballots shall be in form and in all other respects as required by the Acts of Assembly of Pennsylvania, and shall be delivered to the County Commissioners on or before Friday, October 11, 1919, for their approval; and all ballots, official and specimen, must be delivered to the County Commissioners' office by 12 o'clock noon, Tuesday, October 22, 1919. Full information as to the manner of preparing and returning ballots required for each voting district can be had from the undersigned.
