

STUDENT BODY TO MAKE PLANS FOR CAMPAIGN

Council of Episcopal Church Begins a Three-day Program

Ann Arbor, Mich., Oct. 10.—Professors from many colleges and universities, Episcopal clergymen from many towns where famous institutions of learning are situated, and students of the Episcopal faith at many of these schools are gathered in Ann Arbor to-day for a three days' session of the National Student Council of the Episcopal Church.

At the Ann Arbor meeting of the Council plans will be formulated for its student work during the coming year and also for interesting students in the nation-wide campaign of the Episcopal church to raise money and workers to expand all its domestic and foreign activities.

The National Student Council believes that religious work among students can never be a success unless the university people, professors, instructors and students alike, direct it.

Student members of the Council will attend the meeting here from Harvard and Syracuse Universities and from the Universities of Virginia, Chicago, Colorado, Kansas and the University of the South; professors who are a part of the work will come from Bowdoin College, Cornell, Lehigh and Tulane Universities, Iowa State College and from the State Universities of Ohio, Washington and Texas.

DRIFT TO SEA IN BALLOON BASKET; RESCUED BY SHIP

Two Men Unable to Escape When Carrier Is Cut Loose

Rivalta, N. J., Oct. 10.—Lieutenant Charles Little, U. S. N., and six men, narrowly escaped drowning in a curious balloon accident which occurred yesterday off the Jersey Shore.

The balloon dropped into Maurice river cove at noon and became snarled in fish nets. In an endeavor to free the basket, which was floating on the surface, the airman cut loose the bag which, with five men clinging to it, floated over Port Elizabeth and Millville.

Meanwhile the basket, containing Lieutenant Little and Chief Boatwain's Mate O'Claire, drifted out to sea. They were picked up at 6 p. m. by a coast guard vessel.

JAPANESE ARE DENYING U. S. ASKED APOLOGY

Say Their Forces Did Not Threaten to Aid Cosack Forces

Tokio, Friday, Oct. 3.—Reports that an apology was demanded by American authorities in Siberia from Japanese officials or that the Japanese threatened to support Cosacks in the recent encounter at Iman, north of Vladivostok, are absolutely denied in a statement issued by the general staff here to-day.

"According to facts which have been ascertained by the Japanese army, two Americans were arrested by Cosacks on the charge of having presented by force the discharge of his duty by a Cosack officer at Iman, Siberia, on September 4. The Americans were transferred to Khabarovsk, on September 6. On the same day, three companies of American troops, with machine guns, arrived at Iman. One company deployed against Cosacks in the neighborhood and the Japanese garrison. The two others were disposed in the town itself."

Glass Scarcity May Cause New Designs in House Furniture

By Associated Press. Atlantic City, N. J., Oct. 10.—The National Alliance of Case Goods Association, in annual convention here, reported that furniture glass threatened to compel the introduction of new designs because of its scarcity.

The delegates are manufacturers of bedroom and dining room furniture, and claim to represent sixty per cent of the output in the United States.

Reports were made that a great shortage of lumber exists and that factories are turning out only a sufficient supply to meet the domestic demand. No contracts for foreign houses are accepted.

The United States Grain Corporation is prepared to divert from its flour purchases, and to sell and deliver to wholesalers and jobbers straight (either soft or hard) wheat flour, clean and well milled, packed in 140-pound jute sacks, (gross weight) basis of \$10.25 per barrel, delivered in carload lots on tracks in territory east of the Illinois and Indiana line, and east of the Mississippi River, from Cairo to the Gulf.

Wholesalers and jobbers in purchasing flour from the United States Grain Corporation must guarantee not to sell at more than seventy-five cents per barrel additional, and the wholesalers and jobber in turn must require a guarantee that the retailer will not sell at more than \$1.25 per barrel over the wholesaler's prices, in original packages, and at a price not higher than seven cents a pound for broken packages of any size.
