STATE CONTROL OF BABY DROPS

Infants Found to Have Been So Dosed That They Are Habitual Users Under Law



Preparations classed as 'infant drops' and which contain drugs coming under the scope of the Pennsylvania anti-narcotic act may not be administered to children except in pursuance of a prescription of a duly licensed physician or dentist according to a ruling made by the State Department of Health and which is now being brought to the attention of the public by the Bureau of Drug Control.

The act allows exemption where the preparations contain certain small portions of various enumerated drugs and investigations by State officials have shown that such medicines have been given so frequently to children that they come within the classification of 'known habitual users of drugs.'

Monthly returns of sales of all such drops have been asked of retail druggists.
