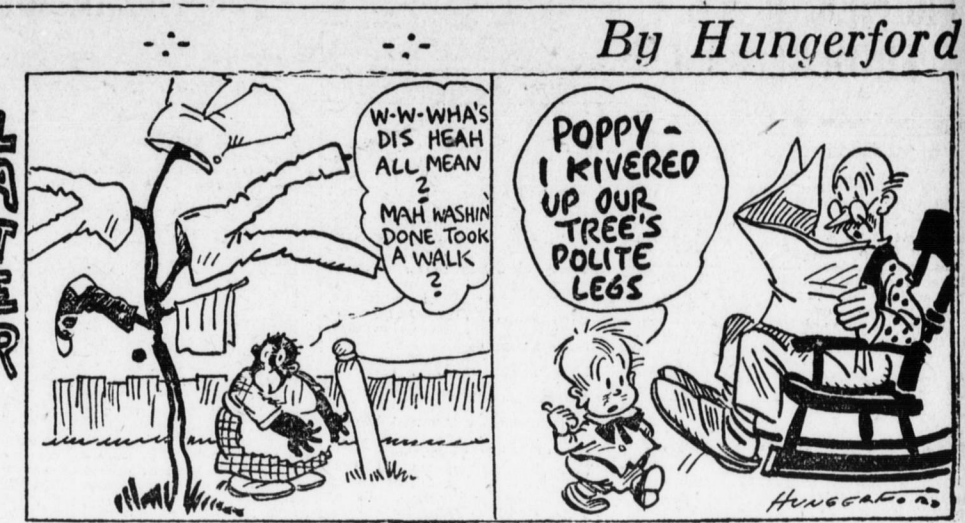
N. Y. STRIKE BROKEN
