Prosecuting Attorney Herman Allen announced D. Lamb, 16 years old, who was arrested here as an I. W. W., confessed to belonging to the organization. The boy, Allen declared, said he had heard his father, James Lamb, who also was arrested, talking of a plot to start trouble here. The father, according to Allen, confessed radicals had four former service men marked for death because of their activities in a fight waged by Centralia citizens to rid the city of the I. W. W. "The I. W. W. expected trouble here Tuesday and they were prepared for it," Allen said. "When the parade was almost over without trouble appearing they decided to start it themselves."

Dr. David Livingston, who served in the war as a captain, was one of the four marked by the I. W. W. for death, according to Lamb's alleged confession. Livingston is the coroner here. He announced the inquest will be held to-day over the bodies of the four former service men.

Clemency Opposed




