SERMON SERIES IN OLIVET CHURCH

Dr. S. A. Bower to Preach First of 7-Sermon Series on Sunday Morning

Rev. S. A. Bower, of Olivet Presbyterian Church, will preach a series of sermons on "The Great Truth of the Bible," on Sunday mornings.

The following themes will constitute the subjects to be treated: "God," "Salvation," "Sin," "Salvation," "Jesus Christ," "The Church," and "Missions."

On Sunday morning the pastor will preach on the first subject, "God." At the evening hour of service, A. W. Bower will preach on the "Christian Citizenship 100 Per Cent. American."

The sermon will be a warning against giving ear to the atheistic or Bolshevistic doctrines of either professional agitators or "parlor" Bolshevists, and a summons to all true Americans to stand loyally by the flag of their country and the church.

The session of the school will begin at 10 o'clock. Miss Alice R. Eaton, librarian of City Library, will make an address on "Books and Life." She will present, for the school, to the class, by Miss Anna Hulbert, a handsome wall banner, for maintaining the best record of attendance among the classes during the summer period.

On Monday evening at 7.30 in the Boyd Memorial Building, W. D. B. Alney will head the Men's Mission Study Class.

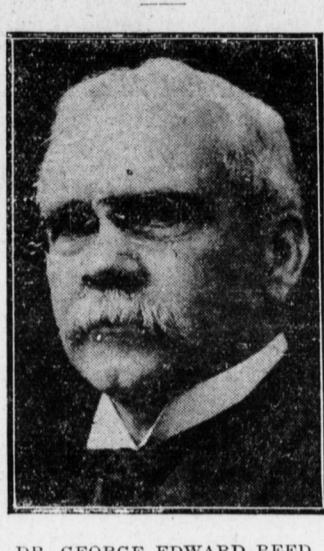

Event to Be Held in Fifth Street Methodist Episcopal Church on Thursday Evening; Banner Will Be Presented to Church Having Best Percentage Attendance

The Teen Age Union of Harrisburg, consisting of all the Teen Aged of the Methodist Episcopal Churches in the city, will hold a mass meeting in Fifth Street Methodist Church, on Thursday evening, at 8 o'clock. This Teen Age Union was the first organization of its kind to be formed in all of Methodism.

This is the second mass meeting that this organization has held, the last one held at Grace Church, the Grace Methodist Teen Age Department being the originator of this Teen Age Union idea.

Music by Fifth Street Orchestra; hymn; prayers; special musical number by orchestra; reports from each department; offering; two-minute speeches by each of the Methodist pastors of the city, and by the District Superintendent, Dr. Edgar R. Heckman; special address, "America: Illustrated Lecture, 'Down on the Border,'" by Charles H. Crist, president of Grace Methodist Teen Age Department, and vice-president of the Teen Age Union.

Special slides have been secured for the lecture from Chicago. After the illustrated lecture, the Teen Age banner, now held by Grace Teen Age Department will be awarded to the successful contestant.

Rev. E. C. Keboch Sunday School Specialist of the Board of Sunday Schools, was the originator of this Teen Age Union idea. Charles W. Boll, Superintendent of the Teen Age Department of Grace Methodist Episcopal Sunday School, and Mrs. Harry P. Motter, Superintendent of Epworth Methodist Episcopal Teen Age Department, have been the counselors of this Union for the past year.
