YANKS STAY OVERSEAS TO SEEK FORTUNES

Two Thousand or More Discharged Soldiers Stay in France in Search of New Opportunities; Many Open Way For Business Enterprises

Paris, Nov. 18.—Several thousand discharged American soldiers who remained in France to try their fortunes are faring as must fare all pioneers. A few have become reasonably wealthy. Some are "reporting progress." The majority, however, like their fathers before them, in the United States, are struggling on life's way, over or around obstacles, with their carts hitched to stars that are flying rather lower than they were when the young men set out to "Americanize France."

Most of the men really are pioneers because they are striking out for themselves, along new lines. As yet there is no organization to put these men in contact with their fellows for the exchange of ideas and experiences.

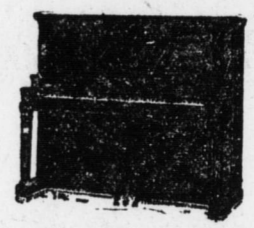

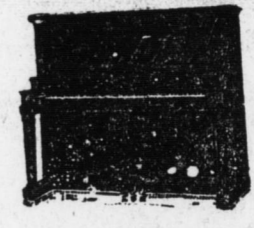
