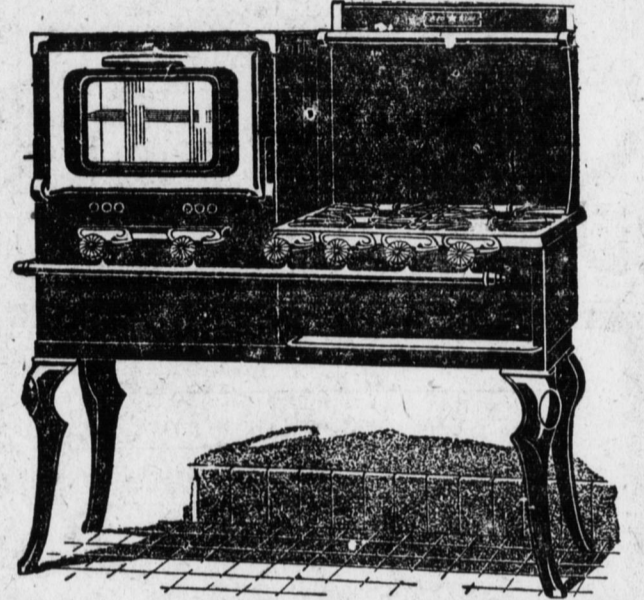
Goldman and Berkman to Be Deported Friday
