Washington, Dec. 12.—The Supreme Court having refused to interfere with the government's plan to deport Alexander Berkman because of his anarchistic activities, immigration authorities are prepared to send the radical leader to Soviet Russia. This is to be done, Commissioner General of Immigration Caminetti announced, "in the very near future."

Cow Yields in Year 1,000 Lbs. Butter

New York, Dec. 12.—All records for the production of butter are believed to have been broken by the registered yearling Lulu Alpha, of Ashburn, which produced 13,609 pounds of milk from which 1,000 pounds of butter were made in the year ending November 1, according to a statement made yesterday by the American Jersey Cattle Club.

30,000 Yellowstone Elk Herd Faces Extinction

New York, Dec. 12.—The famous elk herd in Yellowstone Park, numbering 30,000 animals, faces extinction because of the heaviest snowfall in thirty years and the slaughter of animals in Montana, where they have been driven in search of food, according to Robert S. Yard, executive secretary of the National Parks Association.
