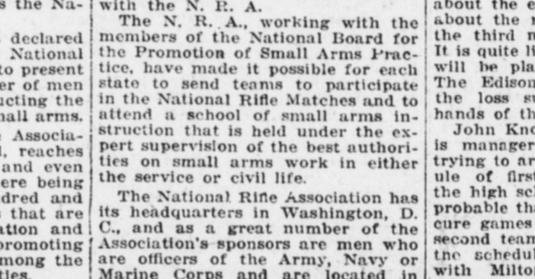

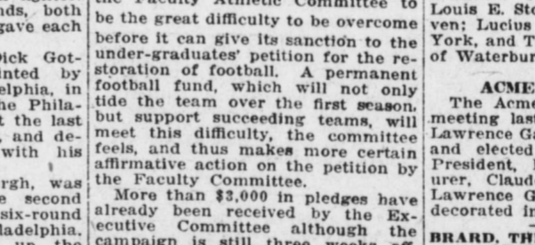
"Tex" Rickard Wants Part of Big Fight Proceeds
