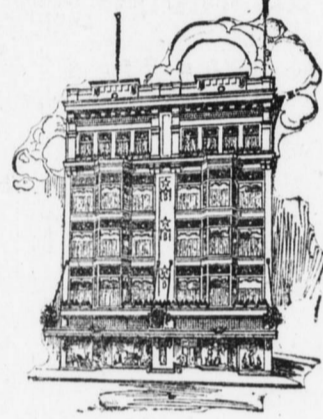

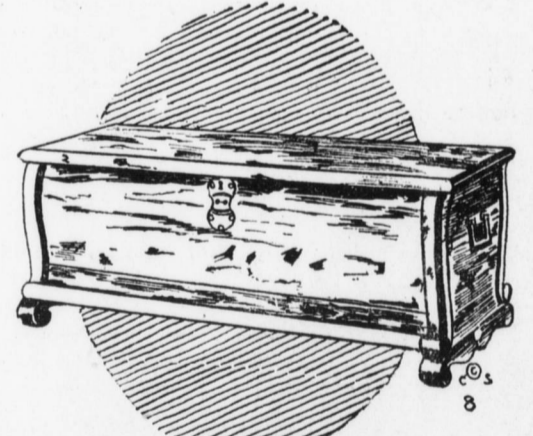

Pittsburgh, Dec. 20—More than 800 butchers and their helpers employed in Pittsburgh packing houses, have returned to work after an eight weeks' strike, upon assurance, it is said, that packers would consider the demands in January. The butchers' demands include an increase in wages; an eight-hour day and a 40-hour week guaranteed.

Philadelphia, Dec. 20—Frederick Dent Casey, a nephew by marriage of General U. S. Grant, died here yesterday. He had been living here temporarily for a year undergoing treatment by a physician.
