U. S. Explains Radicals' Deportation in Cables to "Foreign Capitals"

Washington, Dec. 23.—An explanation of the deportation of 249 radical Russians on the transport Buford was cabled by the State Department today to "various foreign capitals."

The message said precaution had been taken "to request for their safe conduct and humane treatment at the hands of the authorities under whose jurisdiction they will pass enroute to Soviet Russia."

There are being deported from the United States about 250 citizens of Russia who are undesirable here. These persons, while enjoying the hospitality of this country, have conducted themselves in a most objectionable manner, and while enjoying the benefits of living under the protection of this Government, have plotted its overthrow.

They hold theories which are antagonistic to the orderly processes of modern civilization. They have indulged in practices which tend to subvert the United States guarantee to its citizens. They are arrayed in opposition to government, to decency, to justice. They plan to use every activity to incite to violence in derogation of law.

They are anarchists. They are persons of such character as to be undesirable to the United States of America and are being deported when they came. The deportation is in accordance with the law.

Precaution has been taken to request that the authorities under whose jurisdiction they will pass enroute to Soviet Russia.

U. S. Sends Two More "Insistent" Notes to Mexico on Her Latest "Outrages"

Washington, Dec. 23.—The case of the United States against Mexico was supplemented by two additional cables sent to the Mexican government today, calling attention to the "outrages" such as the kidnaping of Frederick Hugo by Villistas, shall not be repeated, and also to inform the government that right now United States sailors held in jail at Mazatlan since their arrest, November 12, on the charge of assault and battery.
