Above appears, in due form, the
usual call for the meetings to fix upon
the candidates of the dominant party

livelihood without much labor;
whereas, in truth, they are instituted
to advance the interests, and protect
the rights, of the people.If this view be correct, no man has
any paramount "claim" upon any
office, but the People have a "claim"

they are best adapted. It follows,
