

The South make Fun of it, too!

One would think—to read the Buchanan papers—that it was murder, or treason at least, for thoughtless boys in the North to play a joke on the Women in the Brown affair. But the South commenced the joking by magnifying 5 niggers and 17 crazy whites into hundreds and thousands of armed men! That was the first practical joke in the catalogue. Have not freedom men as good a right to enjoy fun as the slaveocracy?

The Louisville Journal, and a dozen other papers in the South that we have seen, ridicule, most unmercifully, the extravagance and silly fears of the Virginians. They are quite as sharp and satirical, often, as any Northern papers. They think it overdoing the agony, and making a mountain out of a molehill. So it is that Slavery is a ticklish subject, and he-trays, in her trepidation, a consciousness of dangers unknown to the outsiders. Well, such an institution should be checked and not fostered.

Derision—The Charleston (Va.) correspondent of the Baltimore American, of the 1st inst, says, "To give you some idea of the unpopularity among the people of the military rule that now pervades the town, and has outlasted good citizens, with its furs and feathers and excitement, I send you the following copy of a proclamation which has been posted on the corners during the night, despite the vigilance of the sentinels:—"

Warren, Charlottesville is now held by a military force, and its citizens kept prisoners in their own dwellings. And, whereas, there are numerous reports, proclamations, fables, and other divers fustian, issued by the Governor, commanding and chief officers, as well as other small "noblemen" of the same kind by the Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, and the Mayor, Sheriff, &c.

Now, be it known by the citizens of Charlottesville and its vicinity, that I, Gen. Fago Tumbleding, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Lieut. Common Sense, do hereby issue the following orders:—

The soldiers and crew of an attack by Brown's mob, shall remain in their barracks, as in case they expose themselves on the streets, they may run the risk of being hurt.

The General commanding, the Mayors, Attorneys, Councils, Majors, Captains, Lieutenants and Corporals being more numerous than the rank and file, and, particularly, warned to remain in their quarters, as in case of attack, especially during the night, the citizens, who are able and willing to defend the town from all attacks, either by Brown's men or anybody else, may be inconsiderate in the performance of their duties.

Citizens of the State of Virginia and of the Southern States, and the well disposed citizens of the Northern States, are requested to visit our town as heretofore, and they will be protected by the citizens of the town, and the militia, from all military force now quartered among us.

Citizens of the town will hereafter be allowed to pass to their homes and places of business without being interrupted as insurgents or nigger-eaters. By Order, Gen. Fago Tumbleding, Commander in Chief, Brown's Militia, Military Secretary, Charlottesville, Nov. 20th, 1859.

N. B. Citizens from other portions of the State desirous of witnessing Ossawatimisi's persecution will be protected from the "scurrying" of the valiant constablers, as the designation of hanging in public was to alter everybody a night at him, as a warning to all future nigger-stealers.

P. S. Come one—come all! The military shan't monopolize the show!

"TAKEN IN AND DONE FOR."—Some graceless fellow at Altoona, Pa., informed Gov. Wise that one of "Brown's troop," named Cripple, was between that place and Hollidaysburg, where they should inquire of Mr. James Alexander. And forthwith, two of the fastest families of Virginia came on the iron horse, fully armed with revolvers, daggers, hammers, and a few other weapons.

Some lover of the Constitution in Indiana telegraphed that "Mr. Brown was receiving, in a certain cellar, a large number of pikes." On came Gov. Wise's deputies—and found the cellar—a restaurant, in which were some good fish of the pike species, for sale by a "Union-saver" named Brown! The officer "left the Union side," and put "home to old Virginia!"
