On Monday night or Tuesday morning of this week the store room of Abram Mensch in Lewisburg, was entered with false keys and quite a quantity of miscellaneous articles taken. It is evident that there are thieves, young or old, banded or otherwise, throughout the towns of Pennsylvania, as we everywhere see notices of their depredations.

We have received from Hon. H.C. Hickok a copy of the Revised Penal Code of Pennsylvania. We are all bound by the laws here included, and yet no provision has been made for placing them in an early day before the people whose violation of them would not be excused even if they could not know them.

Henry Hunter, died in Johnstown, last week, while intoxicated. His wife was found lying across his body, also intoxicated, and attempting to pour whiskey down the dead man's throat.

Snyder county reports 57 Retailers of Merchandize &c., and 38 applicants for License to sell Liquor.

One day last week, a German book-binder in Harrisburg, named William Giesler, suddenly disappeared. About the same time, Charles Oswald, a German pedlar who boarded with Giesler, missed \$800 or \$1000 which he had kept in his carpet bag.

Gen. Thomas C. Miller, formerly State Senator, died recently in Adams county, aged over 70 years.

Gov. Packer has appointed A. Boyd Cummings, F. W. Knox, and C. F. Kelly, Commissioners to fix the seat of Justice for the proposed Cameron county.

It is asserted as a fact that one thousand barrels of grog were shipped from Philadelphia to Charleston for the "National" Convention.

Judge Menges, of Snyder county, was recently badly injured by being thrown from his buggy by a young horse.

On Wednesday night last, Mr. Mott's store in Tunkhannock, was entered by thieves, and goods consisting of silks, handkerchiefs, and gloves, to the amount of about \$250, and about \$1 in money was taken. Nothing has been learned as to who the thieves were. One handkerchief was found on the creek road, about one mile from the borough.

The Reading Steam Forge is advertised to be sold at auction, on Monday, 25th May. This Forge is a first class concern, adapted to the heaviest kind of work.

It is stated that the Sons of Temperance in Hensburg now number over two hundred, of whom seventy five are females. "Female Sons" are something new. We should like to see a few specimens.

The bill increasing the fees of Prosecuting Attorneys, which passed the late Legislature, applies only to Philadelphia. But we see no justification for increasing the fees there.

The laying of the corner stone of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, at Trevorton, will take place on Sunday the 13th May, with appropriate services.

Just after the close of church services, on Sunday last, a man in the last stage of intoxication was arrested on Water street and conveyed to Jail by officer Fowler. He manifested much stubbornness on his way to the lock-up, and disturbed the neighborhood with his outcries. He was finally tranquilized away in a hand cart--a most unwholesome and humiliating spectacle.--Lock Haven Democrat.

Lawrence Johnson, the well known type founder, head of the house of L. Johnson & Co., Philadelphia, died at his residence in that city, of paralysis, on Thursday of last week. He was held in high esteem by the printing fraternity throughout the country.

On Thursday week, the locomotive of the coal train on the Shamokin Valley road, two miles west of Mt. Carmel, ran off the track in consequence of a broken rail. The locomotive fell on its side, and Fletcher Bird, who was riding on the locomotive, had his leg crushed from the ankle to the knee, so that amputation will be necessary.

One night last week, the house of Wm. L. Post, of Montrose, was entered, and his sleeping room robbed of his own pantaloons containing some money and important papers, and his wife's gold watch. They knew nothing of their nocturnal visitors until morning. The pantaloons and papers were found in the yard.

Philip W. Hilgert, Esq., has been admitted to the practice of Law in the several courts of Dauphin county. He has lately moved to Berksburg, that county.

A colored man, named Johnson, in Philadelphia, being convinced of his wife's infidelity, murdered her, and then attempted to commit suicide. The screams of the children brought other persons to the house, and the man was restrained, although his self-inflicted injuries may prove fatal.

Lyman Hilbert, while engaged in repairing the trestle-work on the coal wharf of James Boyd, in Sunbury, on Thursday week, fell with the trestling, which gave way, and had his collar bone and shoulder blade broken by the falling timber.

A mad dog was killed in North Lebanon township, on Thursday week. The same dog passed through Annville the day before, where it bit a great number of other dogs, which very properly were killed.

Sunday week, Mr. Eugenius A. Rice, a colored man, his wife and little daughter, left this place for Washington, en route for Liberia. Rice has entertained this project for many years, and now that he has resolved to go, we wish him a successful voyage, and life of usefulness in the goal of freedom and equality to which he bends his steps. We are informed that a difficulty happened at Verner's Colliery, Glen Carbon, on Sunday last, between two Irishmen, named William Large and Joseph Colford, which resulted in the shooting and killing of the former by the latter. They quarreled about a piece of garden. Large leaves a wife and five children. Colford succeeded in making his escape, and has not yet been arrested.--Potsville Journal.

To the Huns--Gov Packer has signed the death warrant of Henry Pritts, recently convicted of murder in Somerset county, Pa. The day for his execution is fixed for Friday, June 22d.

The arbitrators in the case of Edward Hoffenstein vs. the West Branch Insurance Company, have awarded the plaintiff \$3,000, the full amount of his claim for losses by fire in his store at Trevorton, in October, 1856. The defence set up was, that a large portion of the goods were sold and delivered to Deppin & Herb, a few days previous.

The Supreme Court of New York State has decided (in the Lemmon case) that Slavery can not be allowed in that State, even as a luxury to travellers. It will be appealed to the U. S. Supreme Court, and give a chance for another Dred Scott decision.

Springfield, Ill., the home of Ab Lincoln, has, for the first time in many years gone Republican by an average majority of 150.

It is stated that Attorney General Black is about to sue E. B. Schuchel for libel. It was by Schuchel's testimony that Buchanan's letter to Walker, proving J. B.'s duplicity, was brought to light.
